SOCIETY OFFICERS

PRESIDENT

- 1. The President is the chief executive and key decision maker of the Society and serves as a visible representative of the Society to the public.
- 2. The President chairs the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee and presides at all of the Society's meetings.
- 3. The President directs Society activities through the President-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer and various Committees.
- 4. The President appoints Committee Chairpersons, and may appoint Committee members or allow Committee Chairpersons to select their own Committee members.
- 5. Along with the other officers, the President serves as liaison to specific Committees and provides the Committees with insight, guidance and assistance.
- 6. The President is responsible for:
 - 6.1. Notifying those members who may no longer qualify as members because they:
 - 6.1.1. have not signed the affirmation statement
 - 6.1.2. have not paid their dues
 - 6.1.3. have not completed their application update within the prescribed time frame
 - 6.2. Carrying out responsibilities as stipulated in the SRMC Action Guidelines For Unethical Practices.
 - 6.3. Verifying that there will be proper representation for delivery of the SRMC's ARM Award at the annual CPCU Convention.
 - 6.4. Authorizing, with the concurrence of the President-Elect and Treasurer, the Treasurer to invest Corporate funds.
 - 6.5. Distributing the Nominating Committee's proposed slate of Directors and Officers to Membership no later than thirty days prior to the annual meeting.
